BIBLE COURSE

The Bible is the world's bestseller year by year yet many people in the western world are unfamiliar with it. Many pass it off as being irrelevant or too difficult to understand. Recently the Bible Society published a course written by Andrew Ollerton to counter this and show that the big picture in the Bible does in fact make sense of life. Two Home groups, including mine, have recently completed this course and all found it inspiring, brilliantly written and communicated. Personally, it broadened my faith and made me excited about reading more. I felt that it was important to give others the opportunity to experience it and so am running it again beginning in September for up to 12 people - 8 sessions each with video and discussion. It will probably be on Zoom on either a Monday afternoon, Wednesday afternoon or evening. There is a cost of £5 for the course booklet. 'GREEN TIP' - by Canon Simon Everett

Vehicle emissions are at their lowest when travelling between 40 and 60mph. Keep within these speeds and you will use around 30% less fuel. It is predicted that around 100 tonnes of CO2 would be saved every year if 5,000 drivers drove at 60mph instead of 70mph. Equally, if you've slowed to a standstill in heavy traffic, switch the engine off.
