## **Remembrance Day Services**

There will be Remembrance services across the Parish of Wareham but due to the Covid-19 restrictions the numbers have been restricted and will need to be ticket only. There will be the customary Royal British Legion service in Lady St Mary Church at 10.55am with a maximum number in church of 100 people, this service will be mostly made up of civic leaders, veterans and uniformed organisations. In view of this there will be a Holy Communion Service, incorporating an act of remembrance, at 9am with the same restrictions as above. There will also be a Remembrance service at Sandford St Martin's Church for the Royal British Legion Ladies Section and a service at St John the Evangelist, East Holme with restricted numbers.

#### Services at Sandford St Martin's

Following the success of the recent Harvest Festival service at Sandford, we plan to hold some additional services at Sandford on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month, alongside the weekly services at Lady St Mary. On Sunday 22nd November at 9.30am there will be a short informal service suitable for all ages. We hope to incorporate the Breakfast@9 Zoom into these services, so that those who are at home can join in via Zoom. On Sunday 8th November, there will be an act of remembrance at the Sandford War Memorial at 10.55am followed by a Remembrance Sunday service in the hall (attendance by ticket only due to social distancing measures). ## **Forthcoming Quiz Night**

# 'Green Tip' - Laundry time

I had visitors for the weekend and have washed a lot of towels and sheets this week. Washing machines use far more energy heating the water than rotating the drum, so try out cooler temperatures, which often get your washing just as clean. Wait till you have a full load before running the machine. Look at the forecast and try to do your washing on days when it can dry outside: most of mine dried completely outside even this week, and the rest finished drying in my airing cupboard. Think about whether clothes actually need washing before you throw them in the wash: could you just clean spots with soap and water rather than washing the whole garment? Consider using an environmentally friendly washing power or liquid, and next time you need clothes pegs, choose wood over plastic.
